

## **Exemption from provisions of Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017**

---

In accordance with section 220 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (the Act), I, Tony Hetherington, Head of High Hazards, Energy and Public Safety at WorkSafe New Zealand, exempt Chubb New Zealand Limited from compliance with regulations 15.16 and 15.17 of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017 (HS Regulations) for the requirements to have a cylinder pre-commissioning compliance certificate and a cylinder import compliance certificate in respect to the Manchester Tank Company cylinder with the serial number AA945008.

I do so having had regard to the prescribed requirements in regulation 15.18 of the HS Regulations; and being satisfied that

- The cylinder is a close match to an approved design that conforms to an internationally recognised design standard for cylinder manufacture; and
- It is not reasonably practicable for the cylinder to gain a pre-commissioning certificate under regulation 15.17 of the HS Regulations.

An exemption is granted subject to the following conditions—

1. This exemption is limited to the Manchester Tank Company cylinder with serial number AA945008.
2. Chubb New Zealand Limited must in accordance with regulation 15.60 of the HS Regulations, stamp the cylinder as follows:
  - a. cylinder AA945008 the approval number LAB7725SP.
  - b. the station mark of the approved test station.
3. Chubb New Zealand Limited must not stamp the approval number LAB7725SP on any other cylinder.
4. Chubb New Zealand Limited must obtain design verification in accordance with the provisions of regulation 15.13 of the HS Regulations for this cylinder within 6 months of this exemption taking effect.

This exemption takes effect on **24 July 2020** and expires on **24 July 2025** unless it is sooner replaced or revoked.
