#### Manned:

The immediate neighbours (that is public, most likely to be effected) would be contacted by telephone in the event of a major incident (for example Chloropicrin release) at the Leicester's NZ Limited facility. Current phone numbers are documented in the emergency flip-chart and in the emergency management plan. The emergency services (111) will also be contacted.

#### Unmanned:

Do not approach the facility, members of the public are advised to co-operate with any instruction or requests from the emergency services.

#### Public actions in case of major incident

General information about how the public should act and any precautionary steps that people should take if a major incident occurs at the facility:

The general advice would be to move upwind from any detected fumes. Chloropicrin (like tear gas) can be detected by humans at very low levels, causing eye irritation.

Members of the public would be advised to co-operate with the emergency services.
