## Design notice concordance for major hazard facilities

#### Information required in safety case for upper tier major hazard facility

Indicate the location of the information required under schedule 6 of the Health and Safety at Work (Major Hazard Facilities) Regulations 2016. The information provided in the safety case must be suitable and sufficient to allow WorkSafe to make an assessment of any matters that may create difficulties with accepting the safety case required under regulation 45, if those matters are not taken into account in the detailed design or the construction or the commissioning stages.

	(c) the location of any identified external conditions that could affect the safety of the major hazard facility.
